The Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul: St. Peter and Paul were two early heroes of our faith. In today's language we would consider them bishops and Peter the first pope. However, they are both also priests. Like Peter and Paul every priest has two natures: a human nature, which makes him just another man, and a priestly nature, which makes him another Christ. The priest is different from ordinary men as the one who offers sacrifice in His name. Nevertheless, the priest is like every man in his weakness. We drag our weak bodies and temperaments to the altar.

Peter is the one who denied he even knew Jesus. Paul is the one who killed those who called themselves Christians. What changed in these men?

Paul gives us some insight into this change. He talked about what it takes to change the hearts of people. He tried preaching about the Resurrection of the Lord alone and people didn't seem to respond. He preached about the judgment of God and that, too, fell short. What Paul finally had success with is preaching the cross of Jesus Christ. The cross brought out the love and mercy of God which seemed to heal people's souls.

Paul and Peter were both healed by the love of Christ and the cross. What kind of love does this God have who is willing to give up everything, His very Son out of love for us? This is the kind of God I am willing to worship.

Think about the heroes in your life. Did you love them because they taught you a lot? Did you love them because they were fun? Most likely you loved them because of the great love they showed you...the great sacrifice they gave you.

Like St. Peter and St. Paul we have been given a ministry in this world and we do it in God's name. Like Peter and Paul we are human and we bring our strengths and weaknesses.


The only problem I am really facing is NOT having enough volunteers for teaching and helpers for youth groups and VBS, and occasionally, substitutes for teaching and door monitor.


