As I went on my rosary walk this morning, I was reminded of students returning to school. Some are excited about finishing their last year of school as Bethlehem Academy Seniors came to church early in the morning and watched the sun rise and had breakfast together. Other students throughout Faribault and Kenyon are excited to be with their friends while others are heartbroken summer is over. Students at Divine Mercy Catholic school came in like they were storming the castle. They could not wait. While some of the preschoolers and kindergarteners will show tears as they begin something new and scary.

We ask for the intercession of St. Joseph of Calasanz. He lived from 1556-1648 in Spain. He is the patron saint of Catholic Schools (especially for the poor ones). He is the patron saint for colleges and all school children.

One story relates that, as a boy, Joseph used to gather the other children and teach them about God. One day, after learning about the devil, he gathered some youth for an important mission: he wanted to kill the devil because the devil was the enemy of God. One could see this a silly idea as you cannot kill the devil. You can command him in the name of Jesus to be away from you. Yet, the desire to serve God and love God and serve his brothers and sisters is what was planted in St. Joseph by God.

Now ordained Fr. Joseph received a vision of himself teaching large numbers of children with the help of angels in the city of Rome. The vision impressed upon his heart so much that, at the age of thirty-five, he promptly responded to the call. His heart was broken when he saw so many children in Rome were homeless and needed assistance. Among their needs was catechesis but then needed education and formation in every area of life. He ran into many roadblocks as the local schools were filled with teachers that were poorly paid, and they didn't want extra children.

Little by little the churches opened themselves up to classrooms and soon Fr. Joseph began the first free schools in Europe. Two years later he had about 1,000 students in school. The resources came. What should we expect with the help of angels? St. Joseph pray for our children and ask the same angels that helped you to help us.






Faith Formation begins on Sunday, September 7.
