August 13, 2026 (Thursday) - 7:00 pm

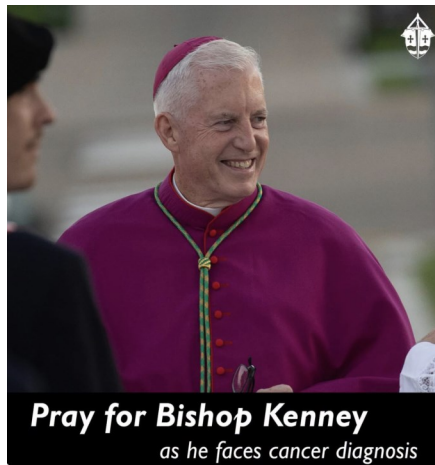
September 13, 2026 (Sunday) - 9:00 am
